You are required to read two books before school begins.

The mandatory book for each grade is:

- K- Only One You By Linda Kranz
- 1st- The Rainbow Fish By Marcus Pfister
- 2nd- Freckle Juice by Judy Blume
- 3rd- Because of Winn-Dixie by Kate DiCamillo
- 4th- The Mouse and the Motorcycle by Beverly Cleary

The assessment for this book will be on the major elements of the story: character, setting, events of the story, problem, and solution. This will take place in class during the first week of school.

You will also read one book from the following titles for the grade you're entering:

- K- The Kissing Hand by Audrey Penn, First Day Jitters by Julie Danneberg, or On the First Day of Kindergarten by Tish Rabe
- 1st - First Day Jitters by Julie Danneberg, First Grade Here I Come by Nancy Carlson, or Chrysanthemum by Kevin Henkes
- 2nd- Peter's Chair by Ezra Jack Keats, Make Way for Ducklings by Robert McCloskey, Finding Winnie, by Lindsay Mattick, or Pinduli by Janell Cannon
- 3rd- Muggie Maggie by Beverly Cleary, Humphrey book by Betty G. Birney, or Mercy Watson book by Kate DiCamillo
- 4th- My Father's Dragon by Ruth Stiles Gannett; Stone Fox by John Reynolds Gardiner; or The Courage of Sarah Noble by Alice Dalgliesh

The assessment for the book of your choice will be your choice of one of the following STREAM based activities. These should be brought in the first day of class to be shared.

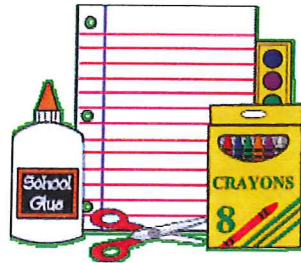
<p>Option 1: Design and create a model of one of the main characters in the story using materials of your choice. Your character should have at least 6 features that directly relates to the text. (If a character loves Star Wars, he/she could be wearing a Star Wars t-shirt, etc)</p>	<p>Option 2: (Grades 2-4) Write a friendly letter to the main character giving advice about a choice he or she made in the story. Remember to use all the parts of a friendly letter; Date, Salutation, Body (at least 2 paragraphs); closing, and signature. For fourth graders, this should be done in your best cursive.</p>
<p>Option 3: Design and create a comic strip detailing the important events of the book. Include at least 8 frames with colored pictures and text to show your understanding of the major events of the story. (At least 4 should be hand drawn.)</p>	<p>Option 4: Create a diorama of the setting of the story or another important part of the book. Include descriptions. Be as detailed as possible. Use color, be creative, and stick to the story.</p>
